We love this carol because it expresses such a feeling of rejoicing in what God has done in sending Jesus. It reminds us of the shepherds – the marginalised and disdained – rejoicing with the angels bringing them the message of peace and reconciliation, a message for all nations both then and now. We can all join, silently this year, in the angels' praise for God in human form, 'veiled in flesh', pleased to live with us on Earth, as the wonderful words of Charles Wesley and the music of Mendelssohn lift our spirits.

From John's gospel chapter one we read:

¹⁴The Word became a human being and, full of grace and truth, lived among us. We saw his glory, the glory which he received as the Father's only Son.

Our next carol has been chosen by Chris and here she tells us why she chose it.

'O come O come Immanuel'

(A carol without the nativity!)

Seven hundred years before the birth of Christ, because of their disobedience, the Israelites were in exile in Babylon. As displaced people they were suffering, they ached with sorrow and cried to God, they longed and yearned for God to come to them, to be with them.

At that time the prophet Isaiah told them "A virgin shall conceive and bear a son and shall call his name Immanuel" – this was fulfilled when an angel of the Lord spoke to Joseph in a dream before Jesus' birth. (Isa 7:14 & Mat 1:23)

This carol brings to our mind the cry of the Israelites but also doubles as a prayer for the first and second coming of Jesus. Every name for Jesus in each verse is full of hope.

As Emmanuel Jesus will pay the ransom for our sins as this was accomplished at the crucifixion. (Isa 8:8)

As Wisdom on high Paul says that Christ is the power of God and the Wisdom of God. He is the source of our life and will give us the truth and knowledge about God's direction for us. (1 Cor 1:24, & 1 Cor 1:30)

As the Branch of Jesse springing from a dead stump (which was the Kingdom of David) he will give new life to Jesse's line. Jesus fulfilled this prophecy being from the line of David and make them free forever. (Isa 11:1)

As the Key of David Jesus rescues us from hell, locks the door behind us, unlocks the door of heaven and brings us home. What he shuts no one will open, what he opens no one can shut. (Isa 22:22 & Rev 3:7)

As the Desire of Nations Jesus will draw the ransomed from all races and make them a kingdom of peace, (Haggai 2:7)

In this carol we can all celebrate the birth and life of Jesus on earth, but it also encourages us to keep an eye on Jesus return.

Peter tells us that we are all in exile and Paul writes "We still wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Pet 1 & 1 Cor 1:7)

So we sing thanking God for Emmanuel and yet still saying:

O Come, O Come Emmanuel.

Matthew chapter 2:1-6

1 Jesus was born in the town of Bethlehem in Judea, during the time when Herod was king. Soon afterward, some men who studied the stars came from the East to Jerusalem ² and asked, "Where is the baby born to be the king of the Jews? We saw his star when it came up in the east, and we have come to worship him."

³ When King Herod heard about this, he was very upset, and so was everyone else in Jerusalem. ⁴ He called together all the chief priests and the teachers of the Law and asked them, "Where will the Messiah be born?"

⁵ "In the town of Bethlehem in Judea," they answered. "For this is what the prophet wrote:

⁶ 'Bethlehem in the land of Judah, you are by no means the least of the leading cities of Judah; for from you will come a leader who will guide my people Israel.'"
