Prayers for the World - Praying for school communities worldwide during the pandemic Lord Jesus,

We lift up to you, this morning, all the school communities throughout the world, at this time of the global pandemic: the pupils, the school staff and all the families.

The closing and reopening of schools, the covid safety precautions that need to be in place, the disparity between rich and poor households, rich and poor countries, the sickness of school staff, the lack of computers, the fear and anxiety that everyone is experiencing, the complexity of it all, we give to you.

We give thanks for the passion and energy of school staff as they prepare and deliver for online learning. We ask that you continue to motivate and help them to make these lessons as rich and as interesting as possible. We give thanks for schools that are open to receive the children of key workers and vulnerable children.

When this pandemic is over, and life begins to return to some kind of normality, we pray for a smooth transition back to school and that the curriculum will give space and value to talking about this time and what it has meant to the children as each one will have had a unique experience. Many will have lost cherished family members and friends. We ask that this time may give educationalists and politicians, all over the world, the opportunity to reflect upon the curriculum as it is and whether it needs reforming to best meet the needs of the children in a post pandemic world.
